## *How can Local Authorities help Communities reduce energy use and shift to renewables?*



Scotland has the world's most ambitious carbon emission reduction targets. A team from the Universities of St Andrews and Dundee is working with Fife Council to co-design a strategy for Local Authorities to reduce community carbon emissions. This seminar is the first of four to explore specific areas in which community engagement by Local Authorities could be extended. It will bring together representatives from Community, Fife Council and other relevant organisations. Further seminars will address Food, Transport and Community issues.

**The aim of this seminar is to directly contribute to a community engagement strategy by which Local Authorities (and Fife Council in particular) can help to reduce Community energy use, increase uptake of renewables and encourage behavioural change.**

**The day will include community and local authority presentations, opportunities for informal discussion and networking, a chance for participants to present their initiatives/ ideas, and a space to collectively contribute to a particular action plan.**
