

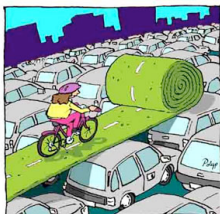


Transport: Connecting Communities Seminar

How can Local Authorities help Communities shift to Sustainable Transport?



The aim of this seminar is to directly contribute to a community engagement strategy by which Local Authorities (and Fife Council in particular) can help Communities reduce their transport needs, increase uptake of sustainable transport, and encourage behavioural change.

Scotland has the world's most ambitious carbon reduction targets. A team from the Universities of St Andrews and Dundee is working with Fife Council to co-design a strategy for Local Authorities to reduce community carbon emissions. This seminar is the second of four to explore specific areas in which community engagement by Local Authorities could be extended. It will bring together representatives from Community, Fife Council and other relevant organisations. Upcoming seminars: Food (April 27) and Community issues (May 19).



Presentations will include: Troels Andersen on the story of [Odense](#), Denmark, John Lauder on [Sustrans](#) vision, Stuart Knowles on [Fife](#) Council strategy, and Crispin Hayes on [North Howe](#) Transition community transport initiative. There will also be a chance for informal networking, for participants to present their initiatives/ ideas, and a space to collectively contribute to developing a transformative transport action plan.
