Introduction

The purpose of this document is to detail the arrangements and regulations that apply to the Global Online Year One (GOYO) Programme.

1. Admission and Registration

Application and admission

The Global Online Year One Programme is open to applicants with an overseas fee status.

Applications are due by 17th August and decisions are made on a rolling basis. Applicants must apply to the Programme using the Global Online Year One direct application form. Transfer credits from other universities will not be accepted, nor will advanced standing credits be awarded.

Registration

All entrants must complete the matriculation process in order to become registered students of St Andrews. This includes completion of the academic advising process and completion of Online Matriculation (including verification of personal details, confirmation of financial arrangements, and completion of the Matriculation Agreement). Entrant students who fail to complete the matriculation process on time will be classed as “No show.”

Students who successfully progress to Year 2 of a degree programme at the University of St Andrews will benefit from a "four-year fee guarantee". Following the completion of GOYO, they will pay undergraduate tuition fees applicable to the year in which they began the GOYO programme, rather than those for the entry cohort in the year in which they begin Year 2 of their degree programme.

2. Academic Regulations

Programme requirements

Global Online Year One students are admitted to the GOYO programme. The programme requirements are published in the course catalogue. Students indicate at the time of entry the subject or subjects in which they intend to progress to Year 2 of a degree programme. Progression is possible onto certain designated degree programmes across the Faculties of Science and Arts & Divinity, although not all degree options are covered. Progression requirements are listed in the Appendix. Progression is not possible onto degree programmes in the Faculty of Medicine.

GOYO students are expected to complete the programme in two semesters of full-time study.

120 credits are required for successful completion of the GOYO programme.

Progression Criteria

Progression to Year 2 of a degree programme

To progress to Year 2 of a degree programme, students must have accumulated 120 credits after two semesters on the GOYO programme, must have passed all compulsory modules for the degree programme that they wish to enter, and must have satisfied the grade requirements for progression to Year 2 of a degree programme, as specified in the programme requirements. Progression requirements for each subject are listed in the Appendix.

In some subjects, students who have not achieved the grades required in modules in their intended degree subject to progress to Year 2 of a degree programme (as specified in the Appendix), are entitled to take reassessment examinations in the modules that they passed but did not achieve the required grades. Grades achieved at reassessment will be accepted for progression to Year 2 of a degree programme, unless the progression requirements for a subject specify that grades must be achieved at the first sitting.

Students who have gained 120 credits but have not satisfied the grade requirements for progression to Year 2 of a degree programme will be eligible for the award of the Certificate of Higher Education.

Students who have gained 120 credits but have not satisfied the grade requirements for progression to Year 2 of a degree programme may appeal to Admissions for entry to a degree programme once decisions about progression have been communicated.

Academic intervention

Students who do not gain 60 credits in semester 1 but can do so through reassessment will be issued with a Progression Warning.

Students who gain 40 credits in semester 1 and cannot gain a further 20 credits through reassessment will be required to take and pass 80 credits in semester 2. The choice of modules available in semester 2 will be subject to capacity and timetabling restrictions.

Students who do not gain at least 40 credits in semester 1 and cannot do so through reassessment will be permitted to continue studying on the GOYO programme but they will be ineligible for progression to year 2 of a degree programme or the award of the Certificate of Higher Education.
