### 1. Introduction

1.1 This Code of Student Conduct sets out the types and examples of misconduct which may warrant disciplinary action under the University's <u>Non-Academic Misconduct Policy</u>.

It should be read in conjunction with the <u>University's Policy statement relating</u> to sexual misconduct and <u>Student bullying and harassment policy</u>. The types and examples of (i) non-academic misconduct and (ii) outcomes set out in this Code are not exhaustive and the University may take disciplinary action in relation to other behaviour if it deems this behaviour to be unacceptable.

- 1.2 The University of St Andrews is a <u>diverse</u>, welcoming and supportive community. We are committed to promoting the highest standards to behaviour and expect all students to treat others with due care, consideration, respect and dignity.
- 1.3 The principle of respect for others and for the values of the University is recognised in the <u>Sponsio Academica</u> and the <u>Honour Code</u> which students agree to when they matriculate. In doing so, students agree to uphold the following promises in their studies and in all aspects of their daily lives:
  - We shall hold true to the principles of **honesty** and **integrity** in all our dealings with others in this community.
  - We shall conduct ourselves in a **reliable** and **punctual** fashion.
  - We shall be mindful of others' circumstances, interacting with **tolerance**, **politeness** and in a spirit of **mutual support** within this community.
- 1.4 Where a student's behaviour falls short of these standards this may result in the University taking disciplinary action under the <u>Non-Academic Misconduct Policy</u>.

### 2. Types of Non-Academic Misconduct and Disciplinary Outcomes

- 2.1 Non-academic misconduct of any type may warrant disciplinary action under the Non-Academic Misconduct Policy. This Code of Student Conduct sets out the types and examples of such misconduct. As noted above these types and examples are not exhaustive. The language may not reflect the language that a reporting person would use to describe their situation, but this should not deter anyone from reporting misconduct. The types and examples of such misconduct are grouped under the following non-exhaustive headings:
  - A People B Property, Environment and Community C Health, Safety and Wellbeing D University
- 2.2 In addition to these types and examples of misconduct, any activity which leads to a criminal conviction will be treated as misconduct which may warrant disciplinary action under the Non-Academic Misconduct Policy.
- 2.3 The types and examples of non-academic misconduct set out in this Code may be in person or through any other medium such as on-line, through text or similar messaging services or social media.
- 2.4 The University cannot make findings about an alleged criminal offence, only a criminal court can do this. This Code therefore does not make reference to

criminal offences, though the types of misconduct described could also constitute a criminal offence.

- 2.5 Where indication is provided in this Code as to the outcomes that may be applied if certain misconduct is found to have taken place, this is illustrative only. This is because:
  - The outcomes of any disciplinary action will depend on the individual circumstances of the case and the stage at which disciplinary action is taken and it is therefore not possible to definitively state that any particular outcome will apply in all cases where a certain type of misconduct has been found to have taken place.
  - Depending on the circumstances of the case more than one/a combination of outcomes will be appropriate.
- 2.6 The outcomes which may be applied at each stage of disciplinary action are outlined in the Non-Academic Misconduct Policy.

#### Type of Misconduct

#### **Examples of Misconduct**

- Disposing of litter inappropriately / failure to dispose of litter appropriately
- Creating, or causing to be created, unreasonable noise
- Inappropriate behaviour caused by excess consumption of alcohol
- Urinating or defecating in a place that causes, or is likely to cause annoyance to others

#### **Examples of outcomes**

- Formal warning
- A requirement to pay for and attend appropriate training
- Requirement to pay for any damages or cleaning charges incurred
- Confiscation of equipment causing unreasonable noise
- A requirement to provide an apology
- Completion of a reflective project/report
- Fine
